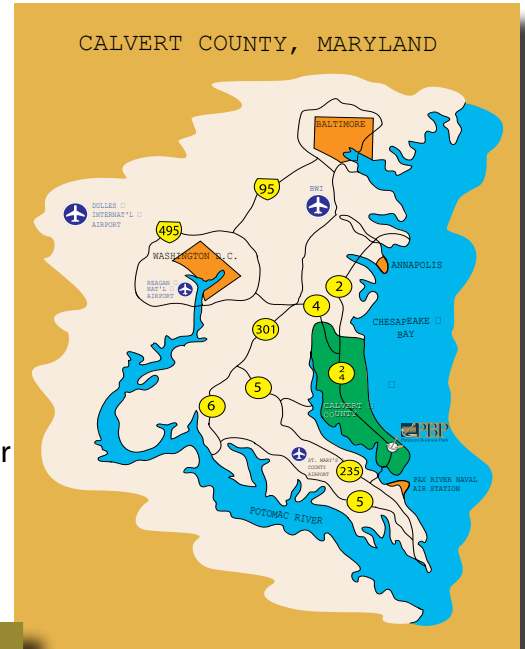


Fast Facts About Calvert County

Population:	90,000 (2009, Department of Planning & Zoning)
Government:	Five Commissioners elected for four-year terms
Elevation:	120 ft. above sea level
Roads:	123 miles of State roads, approximately 500 miles of County roads
Climate:	Summer - 75° F; Winter - 38° F
Land:	213 square miles, 137,725 total acres
Length/Width:	30 miles long, 9 miles wide
Water Access:	No point is more than 5 miles from navigable water
Shoreline:	Calvert County has 143 miles of Chesapeake Bay and Patuxent River shoreline

TOTAL NUMBER OF BUSINESSES:

There are 5,275 businesses; over 20 have 100 or more employees. Principal industries include: utility services, research and development, hi-tech, printing, manufacturing, tourism and health care.

SCHOOLS:

Calvert has 13 elementary, six middle and four high schools; one special education center, one vocational and five private schools.

PROPERTY TAXES:

Property tax in Calvert County is currently \$0.892 per \$100 of the assessed value (\$0.112 State). This rate has been consistent since 1987.

INFRASTRUCTURE:

All of Calvert's major town centers are served by outstanding road systems and public water and sewer.

Targeted Growth Areas:
As part of the County's 5-Year Strategic Plan, the Economic Development Commission endorsed the Town Center concept as defined by the County's Comprehensive Plan. Specific areas targeted for growth are Solomons, Lusby, Prince Frederick and Dunkirk, with Solomons and Lusby being the forerunners due to the base expansion at PAX River.
